## Thank you for choosing to stay overnight at the Zoo!

Dear Group Coordinator,

This packet was developed to answer some common questions and to offer some suggestions to help your evening go smoothly. Please review this packet and make copies of the information pages to distribute to your group members or direct them to our website at [philadelphiazoo.org](http://philadelphiazoo.org) then follow **For Schools & Scouts > Roars and Snores Overnight Programs > Night Flight Overnights** to download this packet.

### Terms and Conditions

**Cancellations** — *A \$200 non-refundable credit card payment is required to hold your date* and this amount will be deducted from your balance. *A 20% non-refundable deposit* is due within two weeks of registration and must accompany your signed contract. **Deposits are non-refundable and non-transferable.** Unused deposits are forfeited and may not be used towards the balance of any other reservation.

*The balance of your program fee is due 28 days before your event.*

### Refunds on cancelled program fees are made on the following schedule —

- A 30 day cancellation notice receives a full refund (*less the 20% deposit and the \$200 hold fee*).
- A 14-29 day cancellation notice receives a 50% refund (*less the 20% deposit and the \$200 hold fee*).
- Cancellations less than 14 days before your program date are **not eligible** for any refund.

**Emergency Weather Policy** — In the event of extreme weather (e.g., severe snow storms, flash floods, etc.), guests are encouraged to contact the Scout and Overnight Hotline at 215-243-5322. As a general rule, if the Zoo is open that day, Overnight and Evening Programs will continue as scheduled. If the Zoo cancels your program, all efforts will be made to reschedule your program within the same calendar year.

**Co-ed Attendance** — We designate some nights for certain genders. On these evenings we will try to book only groups of the same gender (*e.g. Boy or Girl Scouts*). However we **do not** restrict groups from bringing individuals of the opposite gender, so we cannot guarantee that a member of the opposite gender will not be in attendance. On an evening where one group books the entire event, it is the responsibility of that group to set and regulate their own gender policy.

If you have any questions about your program, please call us at 215-243-5322. Due to the nature of the program we may be out of the office during the day, but if you leave a message we will return your call as soon as possible. You can also e-mail us with any questions at [overnightsandscouts@phillyzoo.org](mailto:overnightsandscouts@phillyzoo.org). When contacting us, please leave your name, group name and overnight date in your message.

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## Roars and Snores Overnights At-A-Glance and Packing List

*A basic guide to what you'll need to know and bring with you to enjoy your Overnight experience. Please distribute to all participants in your group.*

### On the day of your Overnight

- Make sure your group eats dinner *before* they arrive at the Zoo. There will not be time for eating once your group arrives and checks-in. You can bring food and eat in the parking lot before check-in.
- Please arrive between 6:30 and 7:00 p.m. for check-in at the Shelly Administration Building located by the entrance gate in the Tiger Parking Lot.
- Carpooling is required. **Limit of one car per every four (4) participants.** See Footprints™ information attached.
- If you need to contact the Roars and Snores Overnight staff on the day of your program, please call the Overnights and Scouts Hotline at 215-243-5322 or email [overnightsandscouts@phillyzoo.org](mailto:overnightsandscouts@phillyzoo.org).

### Packing list (what to bring)

- Sleeping gear (*sleeping bag or bedding, foam pad, pillow, etc.*) **Please do not bring any air mattresses larger than twin size** (*we will ask you to deflate and put away any air mattresses larger than twin size*). This policy is necessary to ensure we have adequate space for all our guests to sleep comfortably. We cannot make accommodations for those wishing to sleep more than one person on the air mattress.
- Basic toiletries (*toothbrush, toothpaste, wash cloth, soap, comb, etc.*) **Please pack in a carrying bag.**
- Money for souvenirs at the Zoo's gift shop (*optional*)
- Change of clothing (*optional*)
- Cameras (*optional*) **We do not permit outdoor flash photography after dark.**
- Glow sticks (*optional*)
- Flashlight (*optional*) Due to animal sensitivity, **guests are not allowed to carry flashlights outdoors**, but they may be used inside.
- Water bottle (*optional*). **No juice or soda please.**

- Remember that you will need to transport your belongings between the parking lot and your sleeping location. Pack accordingly.
- Overnight access to vehicles is limited to emergency needs only!
- Label all gear with your name and your group's name.

**Be advised that outside activities take place in any weather. Please dress accordingly.**

### What not to bring!

- Battery-operated games or radios
- Gum, food, juice or soda
- Air Mattresses larger than twin size. This policy is necessary to ensure we have adequate space for all our guests to sleep comfortably. We cannot make accommodations for those wishing to sleep more than one person on the air mattress.

### All Roars and Snores Overnights will provide...

- Educational activities, crafts and games
- Hikes through the Zoo in the evening and morning
- Live animal presentation
- Souvenir Zoo patches for all children
- Free admission to the Zoo on the day following your program
- Continental breakfast (cereal, milk, danish and juice)
- Evening snack (crackers, chips or pretzels, juice)
- Unlimited coffee/tea for adults
- Playtime
- Free parking

### First Aid and Security

Please be aware of any medical needs your group may have. Zoo personnel are trained in basic First Aid but can only administer external treatment. An emergency medical unit is available to the Zoo within minutes of a phone call. Security personnel are on duty in the Zoo at all times.

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## Night Flight General Itinerary

Please note that we do not provide a specific itinerary. Activities and times are subject to change depending on the needs of your program. This document provides an overview of what your guests may expect during a typical Overnight program at the Zoo.

In the evening...

**6:30–7:00 p.m.** Check-in and Registration.

**7:00–8:00 p.m.** Program introductions. Rules and preliminary activities. Roars and Snores Overnight staff will gather leaders during this time to review Overnight policies and emergency protocols.

**8:00–10:00 p.m.** Evening hikes and animal experiences begin. You are in for an exciting night at the Zoo! During this time you may visit an indoor exhibit, meet a zookeeper, play games, make a craft and hike around the Zoo. Activities may vary depending on your program and time of year.

**10:00–10:30 p.m.** Gather together for a late night snack and a chance to kick back and relax for awhile. Don't get too comfortable though, there's more fun to be had!

**10:30–11:00 p.m.** Animal experiences and activities.

**11:00–11:30 p.m.** Time to get ready for bed.

**11:30 p.m. – midnight** Lights out!

The next morning...

**7:00–7:30 a.m.** Wake up and pack!

**7:30 a.m.** Breakfast is served.

**8:30 a.m.** *Help clean-up sleeping area.* Load gear into vehicles.

**8:45 a.m.** Morning hikes begin. Here is your chance to see the Zoo “wake up”. We'll see animals and zookeepers, animal food deliveries or even our Zoo On Wheels crews packing up and heading out for the day.

**9:45–10:00 a.m.** Your program wraps up and you can enjoy visiting the Zoo.

All Overnight guests are invited to enjoy the Zoo for the entire day *following their Overnight program*. Guests are responsible for loading gear into their cars *before* the morning hike. Gear may not be stored in the Zoo during your daytime visit and Zoo staff is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

Leaders, please notify us if you are bringing a *bus BEFORE* you arrive for your Overnight program. Please let Roars and Snores Overnight staff know what time your bus is arriving so that they may coordinate your departure.

If you have guests that must leave early from your program, we suggest 11:00 p.m. (after the program wraps up for the evening) or before the morning hikes begin at 8:45 a.m. We ask that guests do not plan on leaving before 7:00 a.m. Please alert Roars and Snores Overnight staff upon arrival if you have guests leaving early.

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## Roars and Snores/Night Flight Frequently Asked Questions

Preparing for your Zoo trip.

**Is carpooling required?** — Carpooling is required. There is a limit of one car per every four (4) participants. There are a limited number of parking spaces available. Plus, it is more environmentally friendly and aligns with the Zoo’s conservation mission. Group leaders are required to submit a drivers list for each group. Guests who have concerns or questions about this policy should refer to the Education Department. Please see the attached Footprints™ donation form.

**Where do I park?** — Overnight guests must park in the Zoo’s Tiger Parking Lot. It is the lot that is closest to the Zoo entrance by the Shelly Administration Building, and it is locked overnight. There is not adequate parking within the neighborhood, and therefore is not an option for additional cars.

**Where will we be sleeping for Night Flight?** — Your group will sleep in the Treehouse at the Zoo. The Treehouse is an indoor educational center with several larger than life “environments” to explore. The building has heating in the winter, but *no air conditioning* in the summer months. There are two indoor bathrooms in the Treehouse and we will visit the larger public bathrooms in the Zoo before bedtime to brush teeth, etc.



**Are there “girls only” nights?** — We do designate some nights for certain genders. On these evenings we will try to book only groups of the same gender (*e.g. Boy or Girl Scouts*). However we *do not* restrict groups from bringing individuals of the opposite gender, so we cannot guarantee that a member of the opposite gender will not be in attendance. On an evening where one group books the entire event, it is the responsibility of that group to set and regulate their own gender policy. All guests sleep in the Treehouse but we do our best to have an area where members of the opposite gender can sleep. Please let us know in advance if you have a father coming on a “girls only” night.

**What should I pack?** — Please refer to the “At-A-Glance” packing list. Our best advice is to *KEEP IT LIGHT*. We suggest no more than one backpack and sleeping bag for each guest.

**How far do we have to carry our gear?** — You’ll need to carry your gear through the Zoo to the Treehouse and back to the Tiger Parking Lot in the morning. It is approximately a 10-minute walk.

**What about air mattresses?** — Due to space and public safety regulations, *air mattresses cannot be any larger than twin size* (regardless of how many people will be sharing the air mattress). Guests that bring air mattresses larger than twin size will be asked to deflate and put them away. There are no exceptions to this policy.



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## Should I bring ...

- *A flashlight?* Due to animal sensitivity, **guests are not permitted to carry flashlights outdoors**, but they may be used inside.
- *A camera?* Similarly, **we do not permit outdoor flash photography after dark**, but photos may be taken inside. Although we do not sell batteries during the program, the ZooShop carries camera supplies and will be open along with the Zoo at 9:30 a.m.
- *Glow sticks?* Glow sticks are permitted but not encouraged, since they cannot be recycled.
- *A cell phone?* We ask that cell phones be used away from ongoing activities.
- *Other electronics?* Other electronic equipment is not permitted as it causes distractions to children and other guests. Night Flight staff and the Zoo is not responsible for items that are lost or stolen during your program.

**What time does our program start?** — Check-in begins at 6:30 p.m. Due to other programs happening throughout the Zoo, we cannot permit access before that time. Your program will begin around 7:00 p.m. after all groups have arrived. Please plan on arriving by 7:00 p.m. at the latest.

**Arriving late.** — In order to pack as much fun as possible into one night, we must start on time! If you know in advance that you will have latecomers in your group, please contact us to make arrangements. An Overnight staff member must meet all guests at the entrance gate, so latecomers may experience a slight delay in admission. They will be asked to join your program in progress.

**What time does our program end?** — At 8:30 a.m. the following morning, your group will be required to return all gear to your vehicles before your 8:45 a.m. Docent-guided tour. Your program ends between 9:45 and 10:00 a.m. after your tour. Your orange wristband will allow you to enjoy the Zoo until the end of the business day (*with free parking!*).

**Leaving early.** — Guests are permitted to leave the program early. Guests who cannot stay for the entire program are encouraged to leave after the evening activities wrap up around 11:00 p.m. or before the morning hikes begin at 8:30 a.m. Please notify Overnight staff upon arrival so that they can make arrangements. All guests must be accompanied by a Zoo staff member when walking throughout the Zoo.

## What can we expect during our program?

**What is the itinerary?** — *Please see the “General Itinerary” for a sample schedule.* Last minute changes are often made to account for weather issues, animals and to help things run more smoothly for guests. All Overnight programs include games, craft activities and a night hike throughout the Zoo. Night Flight includes a trip to an indoor exhibit and a visit with a zookeeper. The evening is active and guests should plan on a lot of walking outdoors. Adults are encouraged to be actively involved in all activities.

**What about bad weather?** — We sleep inside, so bad weather is rarely an issue. While we may adjust activities for poor weather conditions, we hike throughout the Zoo all year long. We do not hike when there is lightning. Dress in layers and prepare for poor weather. Even if hikes are cut short or modified due to poor weather, some activities require walking outdoors from one building to another. If the Zoo is closed due to bad weather on the day of your program, we will reschedule your program at no additional charge to your group.

**How many animals will I see?** — This is one of our toughest questions. When it comes to the outdoor exhibits, there are a lot of variables. We do not have overnight zookeeper staff and many animals go inside at night for their own comfort and safety. Some animals have the option of staying out or going inside their individual shelters for the same reason. We have scheduled opportunities for animal encounters with our education collection, a visit to an indoor exhibit and hikes to outdoor exhibits. Your Zoo guide will search out as many animals as possible. Groups that remain quiet tend to see more animals. You will experience the Zoo “waking up” with a Docent-guided morning tour.



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## Food

**Please eat dinner before arriving for your program.** There is not adequate time or space to eat dinner after arriving at the Zoo. **We do not allow outside food at Overnights** (unless it is for people with allergies – please see below).

If you do arrive early and need a place to eat, the closest restaurants to the Zoo are located on City Avenue which, depending on traffic, is about 20 minutes from the Zoo (*but much longer during rush hour*). You may also decide to “picnic” in the Zoo’s parking lot before check-in.

Directions from the Zoo’s Tiger Parking Lot. Turn right onto 34th St., turn left onto Fairmount Ave., turn left onto 33rd St., turn right to get back on 34th St., turn left onto Girard Ave. and take I76W to Exit #339 onto Rte 1 South/City Ave. If you turn left onto Monument Ave., you will see Target, Chipotle, Potbelly, California Pizza Kitchen and Pei Wei Diner. If you continue on City Ave., you will see Taco Bell, Subway, Saladworks, Boston Market, Chili’s and others. If you are driving from New Jersey on a Friday night or a busy traffic night, it is usually much easier to eat dinner in New Jersey.

We provide a light evening snack (*crackers, chips or pretzels, and juice*), and a continental breakfast (*cereal, milk, danish, juice and coffee/tea for adults*) the following morning. Food choices may vary depending on our caterer and availability. You can bring water bottles, but no juice please.

Lunch the day after the program can be purchased at any of the Zoo’s concession stands. Food options vary from burgers, hotdogs and sandwich wraps to salads, pizza and chicken fingers. Food options may be limited during the winter and lighter attendance days. If your group is interested in purchasing boxed lunches for the following day, please contact the Education Department at 215-243-5322.

**Someone in my group has a food allergy...** We make every effort to ensure that our snacks and breakfast do not contain nuts or nut products. However, if you have a child with severe allergies we suggest that you bring a snack and breakfast item in a sealed lunch box or food container. Please give this to the Roars and Snores Overnight Staff upon arrival and they can store it for you until snack and breakfast time (we only have access to a small refrigerator).

## Special Needs

If you know in advance that you will have special needs during your event – physical, dietary, medical, etc. – please have your group coordinator contact us and we will work with you to accommodate your needs.

**Is the program wheelchair accessible?** — **Yes!** All areas that we visit in the Zoo are wheelchair accessible. However, the main entrance for Overnights is **not** wheelchair accessible, therefore an Overnight staff member will need to assist you through a different entry. **Please let us know if you are bringing a wheelchair.** If you need to borrow a manual wheelchair for the evening, please contact us in advance so that we may make arrangements ahead of time.

The night-hike is hilly in some areas. Please let the Roars and Snores Overnight Staff know if you have concerns regarding hiking the Zoo at night.

**Are there electrical outlets?** — **Yes!** There are a limited number of outlets near sleeping locations for breathing apparatus, etc. Please let Roars and Snores Overnight Staff know upon arrival if you will need a sleeping spot near an electrical outlet.

**Is there first aid on site?** — Zoo public safety officers are trained in basic First Aid and are available 24 hours a day. In the event of an emergency, please contact Roars and Snores Overnight Staff who will call public safety. The Zoo is located within minutes of several hospitals for advanced medical treatment.

**Are there nursing stations in the Zoo?** — We do not have a designated nursing station, however we can provide a private location if you request one. Please let Roars and Snores Overnight Staff know upon arrival so they can make arrangements.

**Smoking** — There is a **nonsmoking** policy throughout Zoo. Smoking is **not** allowed on Zoo grounds at any time. Any issues concerning our policy should be directed to the Roars and Snores Overnight Staff.

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## Miscellaneous

**Can I get a refund if my child is sick and cannot attend the Overnight?** Unfortunately, we cannot grant refunds if you or your child is not able to attend the Overnight. In extenuating circumstances, you can call the Manager of Overnights and Scouts, at 215-243-5322.

**One of my children has a birthday. Can I bring a cake to celebrate?** We do not allow outside food at the program and there is not time to accommodate birthday celebrations. Balloons are strictly prohibited for animal safety. Please alert Night Flight staff and they will announce a “Happy Birthday” to any children celebrating a birthday that evening.

We hope this packet has answered most of the questions you may have about our program. Help with the Philadelphia Zoo’s conservation mission! Bring in your old cell phone to our Overnight program and donate it to the Zoo’s cell phone recycling program.

**Return the Call of the Wild** is the Philadelphia Zoo Docent Council’s effort to raise awareness about the effects of cell phones on the environment and to offer a solution.

Cell phones contain many toxic substances, such as arsenic and cobalt. When dumped in landfills, toxins often escape into the environment, contaminating natural resources and polluting wildlife habitat. These poisons can travel through animal and human food chains causing birth defects, neurological damage and cancer. Cell phone parts are also made with coltan, a metallic ore mined very close to the habitat of the endangered eastern mountain gorilla. Excessive mining also causes land erosion and water pollution.

The Zoo receives cash back on all recycled cell phones, some of which are re-used as emergency phones for victims of domestic abuse or redistributed into developing markets such as Latin America for first-time, low-income users. Funds raised through the **Return the Call of the Wild** program go to the Endangered Primate Rescue Center, a nonprofit organization working to conserve endangered primates in Vietnam, home of the spectacular douc langur monkey, one of the most-endangered primates in the world.



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## Roars and Snores Driver List

We require carpooling for all overnight guests. This is more environmentally friendly, plus there is limited parking space available. Each group is allotted one (1) car per every four (4) guests. If you are bringing larger vehicles, you may use some of those spaces as “credits” to cover guests that are unable to carpool. Parking will be at no charge for the evening as well as the following day.

**How big is your carbon footprint?** — Your group may offset their Zoo trip through optional donations to help plant trees in Borneo, Fairmount Park and at the Zoo. See the included Footprints™ flier.

## Driving Directions

From the Benjamin Franklin Bridge / I-95 South / 76 West

1. From **I-95 South** or the **Benjamin Franklin Bridge**, follow the signs to the **Vine Street Expressway (676 West)**.
2. Follow the **Vine Street Expressway (676 West)** to the last exit, **Schuylkill Expressway (76 West)**.
3. Follow the **Schuylkill Expressway (76 West)** to the first off-ramp, the **Girard Avenue / Philadelphia Zoo** exit. The Zoo will be on your left, but you cannot legally turn left, so you will need to turn around...
4. From the exit ramp, turn right on to **34th Street**. Then, at the first light turn right on to **Girard Avenue**. Continue over the bridge.
5. Turn right onto **Sedgely Avenue**.  
*Note:* you are looking for the **first right after** the bridge.
6. At the second stop sign, make a sharp left onto **Poplar Drive**.
7. Turn left back on to **Girard Avenue** and return over the bridge.
8. Turn left at the light to go southbound on **34th Street**. The Zoo will be on your right. The 34th Street parking lot (Tiger Lot) is the first lot on your right, just past the Channel 6 Zooballoon®.

From the Walt Whitman Bridge / I-95 North / 76 West

1. From **I-95 North** or the **Walt Whitman Bridge**, follow the signs to the **Schuylkill Expressway (76 West)**.
2. Follow the **Schuylkill Expressway (76 West)** and take the **Girard Avenue / Philadelphia Zoo** exit. The Zoo will be on your left, but you cannot legally turn left, so you need to turn around...
4. From the exit ramp, turn right on to **34th Street**. Then, at the first light turn right on to **Girard Avenue**. Continue over the bridge.
5. Turn right onto **Sedgely Avenue**.  
*Note:* you are looking for the **first right after** the bridge.
6. At the second stop sign, make a sharp left onto **Poplar Drive**.
7. Turn left back on to **Girard Avenue** and return over the bridge.
8. Turn left at the light to go southbound on **34th Street**. The Zoo will be on your right. The 34th Street parking lot (Tiger Lot) is the first lot on your right, just past the Channel 6 Zooballoon®.

From the Pennsylvania Turnpike / 76 East

1. Follow the **Pennsylvania Turnpike** and exit at **Valley Forge Exit #326**.
2. Follow the signs to the **Schuylkill Expressway (76 East)**.
3. Exit at the **Girard Avenue/Philadelphia Zoo** exit (Exit #342).
4. Turn left at the end of the exit ramp on to **Girard Avenue** to the **first traffic light (34th Street)**.
5. Turn right on to **34th Street**. The Zoo is on your immediate right. The 34th Street parking lot (Tiger Lot) is the first lot on your right, just past the Channel 6 Zooballoon®.

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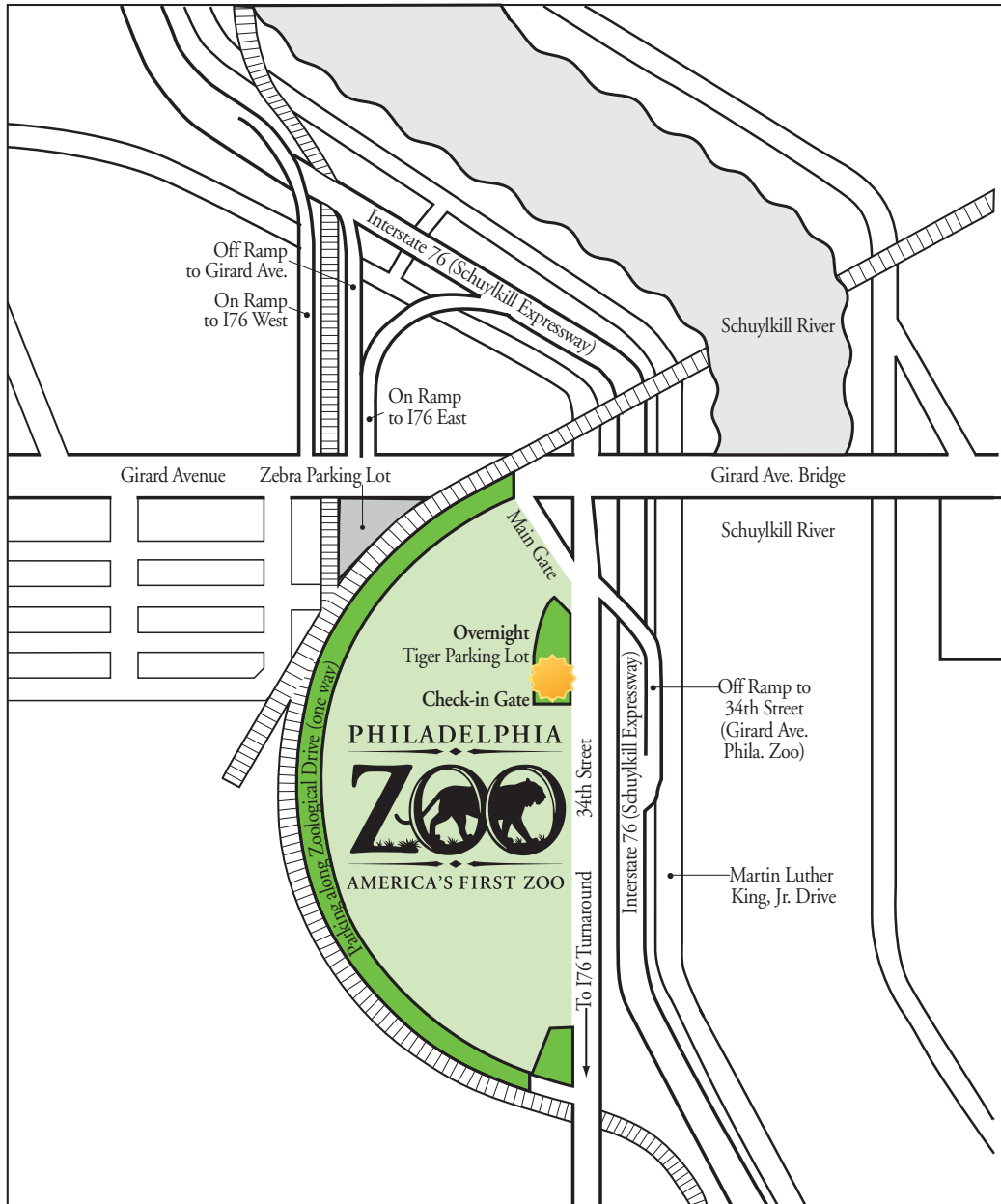


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## Roars and Snores Overnight Parking

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## Roars and Snores Overnights Code of Conduct

Guests of all ages **must** be chaperoned in the Zoo at all times.  
Please contact the Roars and Snores Overnight captain if a member of your group needs to leave for any reason.  
Roars and Snores Overnight guests who do not comply with this policy will be asked to leave the evening.
